or google a local church and the service-member can connect. Not so! This view ignores the cultural distinctions of military life shaping the warrior and his or her family. I was reading a Facebook blog of Air Force veterans describing what it was like to transition to civilian life. Many had gone through multiple divorces, spiraled into alcohol abuse, waded through depression, and fought off suicidal impulses. At issue was their ability to "fit back into civilian life" and missing the connections they had within the military community. Some had grappled with this lack of connection for decades, and combat veterans had even more intense experiences with which to cope. The veterans admitted the VA helped and peer to peer support was of great value. No one ever mentioned the church or using spiritual resources. Yet they sit in our pews week after week burying their experiences deep inside. Most preachers, ignorant of military culture, often have little to say to address the world in which our military and veterans live. The justification of war, frequent deployments, family separation, fear of becoming a casualty, loneliness, exposure to trauma and numerous other issues go unanswered in church lessons. To be sure the majority of military members are not handicapped by post-traumatic stress, they adjust quite well. They live stable and productive lives raising their families and serving God. The challenge for the Church, however, is to speak to these areas of military life as the means to connect our servicemen and women to the family of God. The Apostle Paul would have it no other way!
