Training to Serve in a Broken World

Becoming a strong, faithful Christian does not happen by accident nor happenstance. It takes a commitment to a lifestyle of training. Anyone having served in the military knows the importance of regular, consistent training. From the first day you put

book, *The Stress Effect*, former Army Special Forces commander Henry L. Thompson recounts the intense training Soldiers go through to become Airborne qualified. The goal of Airborne training, as in any other military training, is for one's reactions to become intuitive, doing without thinking about what needs to be done. Thompson concludes, "Experts tend to make decisions based on the intuitive rather than the rational strategy. Their knowledge and experience allow them to use the intuitive strategy, which in their case is much faster and more accurate than the rational strategy." The combat environment for which our military prepares is usually fluid, chaotic and unpredictable. To survive is to depend on the instincts gained through a committed training regimen.

This is no less true for the Christian. Scripture is full of admonitions for training in God's holiness. Hebrews 5:11-14 directs believers to handle the solid food of the mature rather than the elementary truths of God's word. The very familiar 2 Timothy 2:15 challenges us to become approved by God as workmen who are not ashamed in handling the word of truth. Ephesians 4:17-24 directs us to not live in the ignorance of unbelievers with their immoral lifestyle but to live as children of light with a new attitude as befits the children of God.
