### THE MINISTRY OF HOSPITALITY

Military Spiritual Formation

The Bible clearly reveals that God seeks spiritual people, a faith community focused not on this world but fixed on our heavenly home (Hebrews 11:16). Being spiritual connects us with God, becomes the basis for serving others, and leads us to live in fulfillment of the eternal hope which Jesus made possible through his sacrifice.

Spirituality is also an essential characteristic for

those in military service. In 2011 the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff established the Total Force Fitness program aimed at building resiliency in our warfighters. Total Force Fitness

consists of eight domains to achieve personal wellbeing including the Spiritual domain defined as the "ability to maintain beliefs, principles, and values needed to provide support in times of stress." It echoes the words of General George Patton, "Wars may be fought with weapons, but they are won by men. It is the spirit of men who follow and of the man who leads that gains the victory." For the Department of Defense spirituality is not specifically a religious practice, they view it more from a psychological perspective, but the DoD recognizes that religious faith contributes to the overall health and mission effectiveness of the individual.

From the beginning, AMEN has labored to develop the spiritual nature of servicemen and women. Central to this effort are the Key Men and Women who cultivate spirituality by connecting military personnel with a local church. Establishing community with a local church for worship, fellowship and service should not be underestimated in forming spiritually sound disciples in uniform. But our Locator Service is not a mere directory of church contacts, Key Men and Women play a more important role of military spiritual


formation. They are used by the Holy Spirit in the ministry of hospitality (Romans 12:6-7, 13; 3 John 5-8). Christianity is at heart a relational experience between God and people (Hebrews 2:10-

11). The message of the Cross centers on the relationship of those reconciled to God by Christ's blood (2 Corinthians 5:17-21). Growing in Christ is a relational effort under the teaching and guidance of spiritual leaders (Ephesians 4:11-13). In order to thrive spiritually in the highly mobile nature of military life disciples in uniform need the hospitality offered by churches near military bases and by military brethren themselves. Not all Key Men or church leaders understand the importance of this hospitality ministry. The role of the Key Man or Woman is to do more than send a contact an email or phone call. They are given the opportunity to spiritually mold a servicemember's life through their hospitality. This is AMEN's vision for "Building the Love of God in the Heart of the Warrior!"

### HELPING VETERANS TRANSITION

God's Word for Warriors Trains Church Leaders

Transitioning from military to civilian life has its own challenges, not the least of which affects veterans headed to college. Dr. Tom Seals, Lipscomb University Bible Professor and Chaplain to Veteran Students, has prepared an excellent tool for veterans to



make that change in his book God's Word for Warriors. The book is the basis for his classes with veteran students and is being used to train church leaders working with veterans outside of university life. Topics include The Importance of a Faith Community, Overcoming Fear and Guilt, Depression and Suicide, Discovering Peace and other pertinent topics. An Army NCO writes, "Returning from combat is hard; transitioning back into a civilian role is harder. Dr. Seals eloquently tackles the very real issues today's veterans face after service." Local churches are enthusiastic about the results they are having with veterans in their communities. The nucleus of the group is located in Mid-Coast Maine, with other supporting partners in several other states. The program has afforded our church and the local community to continue to support our troops. The effort has grown from 10 boxes to 4 units in 2013 to 296 boxes to over 40 units in 2017. Northwest Church of Christ, Fort Sill, OK. Mark Sexton has passed Key Man duties to Bob Morris, age 91. Mark continues to be completely involved in the weekly worship services, spiritual growth, and sharing of the gospel of Christ to soldiers in BCT as well as the weekly BCT Soldier Prayer Request and Encouragement Program. They estimated reaching 3,000+ soldiers in training in 2017 with over 200 trainees obeying the gospel and being baptized into Christ.
