¥WHO NEEDS MILITARY MINISTRY?

"My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work...Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." John 4:34-35 NIV.

Often when I travel around visiting churches near military installations, I am amazed at how often I get the "deer in the highlights" look from brothers and sisters when discussing military ministry. Even more disturbing is when I ask brethren to

be contact persons, our Key Men and Women for the Locator Service, I sense an attitude of almost indifference. For many the response goes something like this, "We have regular worship services and Bible classes, isn't that enough?" "Just send us their name and we will

email them with our service times." Who needs an in-depth ministry uniquely designed for military members? This response may be due to the reality that the military exists to conduct war and that makes many Christians very uncomfortable.

What is unquestionable is that most in our fellowship just don't see the need for being specific in our care for military Christians. I am not alone in this as I've heard from others involved with the military who are, "deeply concerned about the lack of Spiritual interest that the brotherhood has for families and loved ones serving in the miliary worldwide." What opportunities are missed when we fail to understand the unique needs of those who risk their lives in the U.S. Armed Forces. We need to heed Jesus' words to the disciples in John 4:34-38 that the military fields, like the Samaritans in their day, are ripe for the harvest.

Military ministry must confront several distinctive issues if it is to effectively serve those in uniform and their families. Not the least is the issue of a Christian going to war, a debate which has raged from the earliest years of the Church. We must face the fact that many Servicemembers may be dealing with the effects of combat trauma. Most of these combat veterans carry the scars of war silently, deep within their souls. (cont.) >

Another important issue is understanding the culture of the military overall and recognizing the distinctive sub-culture of each Service Branch as it effects their faith walk and quality of life. Servicemembers grapple with the isolation of months at sea aboard naval vessels; lengthy periods of family separation for armor or infantry units while in field training; isolation that comes sitting alert in a missile silo or standing watch at radar site; etc.

Then there is the stress that comes with frequent short notice deployments or the endless, demanding routine of exercises and inspections. The Church should also consider the impact on life for the families who wait at home. Military ministry recognizes these realities, seeks to empathize to find ways to support those called to bear the burden of national defense. If God calls some as servants of justice and protectors of the innocent, the Church must be willing to support them in their faith.

Military ministry is nothing less than the practical application of our profession of faith in the Lord's Supper observed each Sunday. At the table we proclaim hope and healing through Jesus Christ and his sacrifice. Focusing on the unique needs of military Christians is our way of extending the grace of Christ to those exposed to the worst humanity has to offer.

The section Military Ministry Resources has valuable material that can be used in Bible classes or small group meetings to address topics military members need to talk about but won't find in traditional Bible school. As long as sin leads to international conflict and violence the Church needs military ministry.
