First, are Don and Harriet Yelton who took a vision of ministering to the military and developed and led AMEN for 40 years. They were the first to recognize the unique needs and challenges military Christian's face in performing their duties and came up with a plan for churches to address these needs. Their efforts had far-reaching effects not only for connecting military Christians with churches but bringing many to Christ and recruiting numerous preachers throughout the 1970s and 1980s. Additionally, their work organizing food convoys to Poland using military members as drivers during the end of Cold War became a standard for other international relief efforts.

Pensacola, Florida

Steve and Jessie Coffin, both active-duty Navy when they married at Whiting Field in Milton, FL, now live in Pensacola and worship with the Warrington congregation. They have supported AMEN since the early 1970s, inspired by Don Yelton's vision for connecting and encouraging Christians in the military.

Steve's notable experiences, including deployment to VAW-115 onboard the USS Midway (CV-41), highlight the importance of military ministry. He obtained an Ecclesiastical Endorsement, allowing the ship's Chaplain to arrange for Church worship services at 10:00 pm on the Lord's Day, growing to a congregation of about 35. They taught The Plan of Salvation and baptized sailors in a steel treatment tub from the Medical Dept. Steve also preached and fellowshipped with the Filipino congregation of Olongapo, worshipped with brethren in Perth, Australia, & served on Guam while a member of VQ-1.

At Warrington Church, he meets with Chaplains of Corry Station and the Naval Air Technical Training Center aboard NAS Pensacola. They keep pamphlets at those sites and provide rides for students. Many members treat students to lunch after services. Visitor Cards are given to military "guests" to maintain contact while in school. They use Ivan Stewart's Open Bible Study, Jule Miller, and World Video Bible School materials, and provide the "Searching for Truth" DVD to help soul winners.

Most military visitors are unaware of the AMEN program but leave with an appreciation for it. They hand out AMEN material and help military Christians stay faithful, inviting non-member friends to "come and see." They keep in touch with many students who graduate and serve worldwide. It's a blessing!
